

## FULLERTON PUBLIC LIBRARY INTERNET USE POLICY

In keeping with its mission to provide services and materials to meet educational and informational needs of Fullerton's culturally diverse community, Fullerton Public Library makes available public access to the Internet's local, national and international sources of information, vital to intellectual inquiry in a democracy. In defining the Internet's resources as an extension of the library's resources, Fullerton Public Library intends that they be used for educational, research or cultural enrichment purposes.

Users of the Internet should be aware that the Internet is a global entity. The library does not monitor and has no control over the information on the Internet and cannot be held responsible for its content. Internet sites may contain information which some persons find controversial or offensive. Fullerton Public Library neither censors access to materials nor protects users from information they may find offensive. Moreover, not all sources on the Internet provide accurate, complete or current information. Internet users are solely responsible for verifying the validity and/or accuracy of information obtained from using the Internet.

Library cardholders are given a choice of filtering options: filtered, unfiltered or blocked. Any restriction or monitoring of a minor's access to the Internet is the sole responsibility of the parent or legal guardian. Parents or legal guardians are permitted to select the preferred filtering option for their own children.

Internet users shall respect the rights and privileges of each other and other library users. Abusive or harassing behavior that demeans, intimidates, threatens or injures another may be subject to discipline by the Fullerton Public Library, including, but not limited to, termination of the right to use the Internet. Any Internet user found accessing pornographic, obscene, lewd or sexually or racially offensive material will be subject to discipline by the Fullerton Public Library, including, but not limited to, termination of the right to use the Internet.

Library Internet users shall act in a responsible, ethical and legal manner, conforming to network etiquette, customs and courtesies, and in accordance with the rules for Internet use established by the Fullerton Public Library, the missions and purposes of other Internet providers, and the federal, state and local laws. Illegal activities or any other activities that interfere with or disrupt network services, users or equipment, such as hacking, are prohibited.

Materials obtained or copied through the Internet may be subject to copyright laws. A work protected by copyright may not be copied without permission of the copyright owner unless the proposed use falls within the definition of "Fair Use." Violation of the copyright law may subject a violator to an action for damages and/or an injunction. The copyright law of the United States (Title 17 U.S. Code) governs the making of copies of copyrighted material. The person using library computer equipment is liable for any infringement.

Access to the Fullerton Public Library Internet workstations is a privilege offered to any library user under the Internet Use Policy. The Internet user is held responsible for his or her actions and activities on the Internet. Unacceptable uses of the network shall result in the suspension or revoking of this privilege. The Fullerton Public Library reserves the right to regulate both the use of the public Internet workstations and the material accessed by users.
