





Looking Back in Fullerton

On September 21, 41 curious residents came to the Fullerton Library to find out about life in Fullerton one hundred years ago. Local historian Jesse LaTour took the group on a journey through a simpler, smaller town on the verge of a population boom. Stories were told about Charles Chapman - his citrus empire and his potential vice-presidential nomination, about a visit from baseball Hall-of-Famer Babe Ruth and his epic baseball battle with Fullerton's own Walter Johnson on the Brea oil fields, as well as a worrisome rise in KKK activities in the county and our shameful history of housing racial covenants. Several items from the Local History Collection were on display including the original blueprints for the California Hotel, Fullerton High School and Fullerton College annuals from 1924, and an oversized Jail Log where one of our "lucky" visitors found their grandfather's arrest documented!

The Friends of the Fullerton Public Library had a wonderful book sale the last weekend in September. Hundreds of community members attended the book sale and left with smiles and new books to read. The Friends receive thousands of book and media donations throughout the year and we thank the community for their generous donations.
