NEW KOHLENBERGER PLANT TO HAVE 150 LOCAL EMPLOYEES

The Kohlenberger Engineering Corporation of this city, founded by H.H. Kohlenberger in 1922, has purchased a tract of approximately six acres on West Commonwealth Ave., on which it will erect a new factory for the manufacture of refrigeration machinery and equipment.

The main factory building will be approximately 700 feet in length, of steel and stucco construction. An administration building will be erected near the corner of Commonwealth and Basque Aves.

This new plant is necessitated by the growth of the company's business which features a complete line of re-

frigeration equipment for all types of commercial and industrial installations from $\frac{1}{4}$ to 300 h.p.

The company's installations in the domestic field range from meat markets, restaurants, flower shops, dairies and grocery stores, to ice-making plants, cold storage warehouses, citrus pre-cooling plants, locker plants and quick freeze installations

The company has equipped a large number of fishing boats on the Pacific Coast with the Kohlenberger quick-freezing system.

Many of the Army and Navy cold storage plants installed in the Pacific were equipped by the company.

During the war the company made many parts for the "Water Buffalos" which played a major role in successful landings in the Pacific.

At the present time the company has a large domestic backlog of orders, which will keep the plant operating at peak capacity for many months.

The company will employ approximately 150 employees in their new plant, with an annual payroll of around \$400,00, which will be an asset to the community.
